Internet Safety

Our Primary 6 and Primary 7 classes attended Internet Safety Workshops on Thursday 22nd March 2018 as part of our Care and Welfare Project. These have been organised by the PSNI's Community Police Service. There will also be a Parents' Evening in relation to Internet Safety on **Monday 16th April 2018** at 7pm in Warrenpoint Town Hall. Everyone is welcome to attend this event, which promises to be most informative and enjoyable.

Health Needs

Children Pox, Shingles and Measles pose a significant risk to one of our Primary Five pupils, who is recovering from leukaemia. Could you please contact the school immediately if your child develops any of the above conditions, so that we can relay the information to the relevant family.

In addition, a child in the Primary 1-year group, the Primary 5-year group and in the Primary 7 year group have severe nut allergies. Reactions can be fatal. Consequently, I would ask you to avoid sending in nuts or nut products. I would appreciate your co-operation with regard to this matter.

Traffic at Hometime

Can we ask all those dropping off or collecting children at the school, to be extra careful and to observe the normal rules of a roundabout. Children must not disembark or climb into cars until cars have parked. We appreciate that it can be frustrating having to wait in the queue until the traffic moves on but we would ask everyone to exercise caution so as to try and avoid accidents. **Could we also ask drivers to ensure that parking spaces are always available at the front of the school for disabled drivers.**
